General Membership Meeting
May 12, 2026

Meeting Called to order by President Bill Clough with Pledge of Allegiance and roll call of officers.

A video presentation by Bob about the club and the rules and regulations of the club for those interested in joining the club.

Minutes from the April 14, 2026 meetings were read. M-S-P to accept the minutes.

The proposed changes to the bylaws were read for the third time. They are,

Under Article IV Membership Section 3- B, there will be no initiation fee for junior members and the membership dues will be one-half of the adult dues.

Under Article IX section G, of the bylaws move the Board of Directors meeting to Tuesday after the General Membership meeting.

Under Article IX section H of the bylaws take out the part about the Board of Trustees. There has not been a Board of Trustees in years. A vote on the bylaw changes was taken.

M-S-P to change the bylaws.

The proposed new members were asked to rise. A motion was made to accept the prospective new members. A vote was taken and it was M-S-P to accept the new members. 29 new members joined the club.

Archery – the 3D shoots held every Wednesday evening started last month. The first one had to be canceled because of the weather. The next three shoots had a total of 84 shooters. They could use some extra help to run the shoots.

Trap – They won the Central Penn Winter League last month. They average \$100 to \$120 revenue each week at the practices. A check for \$1500.00 was given to the club treasurer to draw down the committee's balance. The Summer League has started.

Black Powder – They had 20 shooters at the April 18th match, collected \$700.00 in fees and setter tips. The expenses were \$260.00 with \$440.00 profit for the event.

Coming into 2026 there was \$417 in currency and \$76.00 in the bank. Through April they have collected \$1,118 in fee and tips. They expended \$440.00 in setter tips and \$105.00 on award pins. They will be depositing \$900.00 into Orrstown Bank account before the May meeting.

Several of the ram targets are in need of repair and a few of their shooters will be making arrangements to repair them in the coming weeks.

Ralph Carruthers is considering distributing new mineral aggregate materials on the 200 meter Chicken berm to see if the resist erosion and prevent vegetation growth better than the current sand. It will still provide a background contrast for the shooters. If the new materials work, they may decide to apply it the other berms. There is a super shoot scheduled for June 20th.

No reports this month from the Groundhog or Steel Gong committees
NRA – no report.

Old business – Help is still needed for the June drawing. There are sign up sheets to help, set up the serving line, gambling, serving line and help about 2:30pm to clean up,.
The club need a liquor license to serve beer at the drawing. It must be applied for 30 days before the event. This is required every year. This was applied for by the treasurer tonight. This is the club's biggest profit making event for the club and lots of help is needed to make it successful.

New business – Some potential info on the update to the security cameras. Two are needed on the long ranges, 3 on the short ranges, the parking lot, the 22 indoor range, and one at the main entrance. Add card access to the old office and the main office. The estimate is \$30,000 if the front entrance is added and 2 card accesses for the offices. Total is approximately \$40,000.00

Partnership with Hold the Line in support of Protect our Women. There is a proposed separate pistol range behind the main building where Protect our Women will hold their events. Scot Cohick from POW explained the proposed range plans. They will build the range. It was noted that at some point security cameras will be needed for the new range.

A question was asked about steel targets here at the club.
The answer is no.

A question was asked as to what company is doing the camera update.
It is Complete Building Services Inc.

Andy Williams has completed his course in Utah to become a certified Concealed Carry Instructor so he can hold the course in other states.

He plans to hold the following courses in the future, Stop the Bleed, CPR and instruction AED use. He is proposing the following dates for Firearm training, June 20th, July 18th, August 22nd, September 19th and October 3rd. The dates were sent to the Board of Directors for approval.
